2. Distribution of Annual Report

The Port of San Diego provided a copy of the 2006-2007 Coastal Storm Drain and Lagoon Monitoring Annual Report to all of the Copermittees who attended the meeting. Both hard copies and a digital CD were distributed.

The 2007-08 Coastal Storm Drain and Lagoon Monitoring Annual Report is due on Jan. 31, 2009.

3. Copermittee Updates on New Program

The Copermittees revised their coastal monitoring programs to comply with the requirements of the new Municipal Permit (Order 2007-0001). Beginning on October 1, 2007, the San Diego region lagoon monitoring sites were removed from all of the Copermittee's Coastal Storm Drain Monitoring programs.

The City of Carlsbad and the City of Encinitas reported that they have fewer monitoring sites and did not have any water quality exceedances thus far in 2007-08.

The City of San Diego has added monitoring sites to their coastal monitoring program. They are now responsible for monitoring a total of 151 sites and have conducted several investigations this year.

The City of Del Mar and the Port of San Diego are maintaining the same monitoring sites as in previous years and reported that they did not have any water quality exceedances in 2007-08.

There were no updates from the City of Oceanside and The City of Solana Beach. They were not represented at the meeting.

4. Reporting (Monitoring Reports)

A. Weston Report

It was suggested that the CSDM Workgroup look to compare the Coastal Storm Drain and Lagoon Monitoring 2006-07 Annual Report to the Weston Report to eliminate overlap with their report and make improvements to the CSDM Workgroup's future annual reports.

B. CSDM Workgroup Report

Weston's report features graphs which convey information clearly, the CSDM Workgroup's report features tables that are not as easy to interpret.

The CSDM Workgroup agreed to keep the details of their coastal monitoring programs in an Annual Report submitted as an Attachment to the Annual San Diego County Municipal Copermittees Urban Runoff Monitoring Report.

Another suggestion included re-structuring the CSDM Workgroup's Annual Reports to answer the core management questions.

1. Are conditions in receiving waters protective, or likely to be protective, of beneficial uses?
 - Data from the past year or more
2. What is the extent and magnitude of the current or potential receiving water problems?
 - Data from the past year or more
3. What is the relative urban runoff contribution to the receiving water problem(s)?
 - Adaptive diagrams
4. What are the sources of urban runoff that contribute to receiving water problem(s)?
 - Investigation summaries
5. Are conditions in receiving waters getting better or worse?
 - Multiple years of data

Other suggestions included using the info as an overall watershed assessment.

Action Item: Karen Holman and Paul Hartman will draft an outline for the upcoming annual report to include some of the ideas discussed.

C. Report Integration

Action Item: Work with Weston offline to determine best way to integrate reports and eliminate overlap.

5. Other Items

- As required by the new Municipal Permit-Receiving Water and Urban Runoff Monitoring and Reporting Program (Item III., p.16), "the Principal Permittee shall submit a description of the Receiving Waters and Urban Runoff Monitoring Program to be implemented for every monitoring year. The submittals shall begin on September 1, 2007, and continue every year thereafter."

Action Item: Paul Hartman will ask JoAnn Weber to see what was submitted last year. He will review the program plan and discuss the details with the CSDM Workgroup at a future meeting.

- Weston is in the process of reviewing monitoring data through June 2008 and will be soliciting feedback on their analysis.
